#### Raphael Parry

#### **Executive and Artistic Director**

Noted director and actor Raphael Parry serves as the Executive & Artistic Director of Shakespeare Dallas, where he has served in a leadership position since 2002. During his tenure at Shakespeare Dallas, he has directed and performed in over 25 productions written by William Shakespeare and other classical writers. Most recently, he directed A Midsummer Night's Dream and performed the Hamlet Project—Yorick's Last Laugh by Migdalia Cruz. Raphael is celebrating his 20th season with Shakespeare Dallas.



Mr. Parry is the co-founder and former Co-Artistic Director of Undermain Theatre, During his tenure at the Undermain, he directed and acted in over 40 productions. Memorable projects at the Undermain include Goose and Tom-Tom, Ghosts, Disgrace, Camino Real, The Deatherians, an international tour to Macedonia of Sarajevo, and a trio of play commissions from longtime collaborator Erik Ehn including The Red Plays, Beginner, and Shiner (co-written by Octavio Solis). Additional selected directing/ performance credits include An Almost Holy Picture (Echo Theatre); Road, Fool For Love (Kitchen Dog); Tartuffe, A Christmas Carol (Dallas Theater Center), and A Streetcar Named Desire (Zachary Scott Theater in Austin).

As the Founding Producer of Project X: Theatre, he has worked with a cross-discipline group of artists in the creation and fostering of new and experimental work since 2001. The work aims to break down barriers between disciplines and find unique collaborations to forge art for the 21st century. He directed and produced Diamond Dick: The Tulsa Race Riots of 1925 written by Erik Ehn as part of a 17-play cycle that explored genocide in the 20th century called Soulographie. "Diamond Dick" culminated in a two-week run which was performed at La Mama ETC in NYC and was hailed by the New York Times as a "standout production". Most recently, Raphael directed a short film based on Joan of Arc. written by Erik Ehn called Maid. The film has been shown around the United States at independent film festivals.

A recipient of multiple citations from the Dallas Theatre Critics' Forum and the Leon Rabin Awards as a director and actor. Raphael was recognized for his ongoing contributions to the theatrical scene with the Dallas Theatre League-Standing Ovation Award in 2006.

## **Synopsis**

Hamlet returns home from university to discover the world-shattering news that, not only is his father newly dead, but that his mother, Gertrude, has married his father's brother, Claudius, and that Claudius is now king. The resultant instability has also led to threats of invasion by a soldier from a neighboring state. Late one night, the ghost of Hamlet's father appears to him, accusing Claudius of his murder and urging Hamlet to revenge. This sets in motion a train of events that destroys both family and state.

No longer able to trust his own senses, the loyalty of his old friends, Rosencrantz and Guildenstern, or even the affections of his young love, Ophelia, Hamlet fakes madness in an attempt to provide himself with proof that the ghost is telling the truth. Aided only by his most loyal companion, Horatio, he persuades a travelling band of actors to re-enact the story of his father's murder in front of Claudius and Gertrude, hoping that Claudius will be so stirred by remorse that he will confess his crime. During an intense meeting with his mother, Hamlet hears a noise and realizes that they are being spied upon. In rage, he stabs the hidden eavesdropper, believing it to be Claudius. Instead he discovers it is the King's adviser, Polonius, father to both Ophelia and her brother, Laertes. Polonius dies.

Afraid of what Hamlet might do next, Claudius has him arrested and despatched to England under guard, where he has arranged to have Hamlet murdered. Hamlet escapes, returns to his homeland and finally achieves his revenge. The psychological effects of these upheavals on Hamlet lead to some of the greatest soliloquies in the English language and take the audience deep into the mind of Shakespeare's most famous protagonist.

#### Stop reading now if you don't want to know how it ends...

Ophelia, having been violently rejected by Hamlet, hears that her father has been murdered. She loses her mind and eventually drowns herself. Her brother, Laertes, returns to court at the head of an angry mob, determined to find out the truth. Claudius convinces him that Hamlet is the only guilty party and agrees to help Laertes gain revenge. On learning of Hamlet's escape and return to his homeland, Claudius convinces Laertes to challenge Hamlet to a fencing match and advises Laertes on how to kill Hamlet during the duel without arousing suspicion. As a back-up plan, Claudius also poisons a glass of wine which he intends to offer to Hamlet. Gertrude, however, drinks from the glass first and dies. During the duel, Hamlet is slightly wounded by Laertes, who has tipped his sword with a deadly poison. In the ensuing tussle, the swords get switched and Hamlet wounds Laertes with the poisoned one. Realizing that he is about to die, and that Claudius has manipulated the situation, Laertes confesses everything, forgives Hamlet and dies.

As the poison takes hold and he realizes that he too is about to die, Hamlet finally carries through his dead father's wish for revenge. He forces Claudius to drink the remaining poisoned wine, which quickly takes effect. With his dying breath, Hamlet asks Horatio to ensure that his story is told accurately. Fortinbras arrives at the head of his army, ready to assume control of a state whose royal family has been destroyed by betrayal, murder and revenge.







Jenny Ledel (Hamlet) Jenny is a theatre, film, and tv actor living in Dallas, TX where she is an Artistic Associate at Second Thought Theatre, an acting company member at Kitchen Dog Theater, and a multiple recipient of the DFW Critics Forum Award for BEST ACTRESS for her work in numerous professional theatres in the metroplex. Her theatrical credits include Second Thought Theatre, Kitchen Dog Theater, Texas Shakespeare Festival, WaterTower Theatre, Theatre Three, Trinity Shakespeare Festival, The Undermain Theatre, Shakespeare Dallas, and the Dallas Theater Center. At Shakespeare Dallas, she has performed in

Romeo and Juliet, The Tempest, Two Gentlemen of Verona, Hamlet, 12th Night and As You Like It. She is also a theatre director, voiceover artist and playwright.
